PHASE 3 RECOVERY

Gatherings of 10 people or fewer allowed Face coverings and social distancing are the norm.

SMALL GROUP INSTRUCTION

What is Phase 3 -Recovery Plan- Fully Remote?

Students will be fully remote unless in person instruction is agreed upon and pre-planned with the classroom teacher.

- Students will be provided lessons through a virtual learning experience
- Teachers will host live zoom sessions of their class at the time/days listed on the Building Plan.
- Teachers will track who attends their sessions.
- Students can come to the building to work if needed by filling out the <u>Homework Completion Sign</u>

Up form

- If you need to meet with your teacher, please reach out to them and arrange an appointment ahead of time.
- Students not attending class or scheduling to meet with the teacher will be marked absent in Skyward daily.
 - Parents will receive a phone call indicating that the student missed a class session and that the student is responsible for scheduling a time to make it up the work with his/her teacher.
- Teachers will set up Zoom meetings or in-person office hours for students to make appointments for support.
- Mondays & Wednesdays: English & Social Studies assignments will be given via Google Classroom.
- Tuesdays & Thursdays: Math & Science assignments will be given via Google Classroom.
- Fridays: Elective course assignments will be given via Google Classroom with a due date for the following Friday.
- Instructional assignments will provide the same level of rigor and engagement regardless of the selected option: in person or Zoom meetings
- Students needing additional support should contact their teacher directly to set up a virtual or in-person appointment.
- Teachers and school staff will be reaching out to students that are not participating and requesting the support of the parent to ensure the student is actively engaged.

KACC Remote Learning Plan Once KACC Remote Learning Planning is no longer in effect, KACC will operate according to the following: KACC will be open as usual. Schedule:

All students must attend class remotely Tuesday through Friday!

Assignments

Administration will be monitoring the quality of assignments to ensure we are providing students with grade level rigorous materials.

Safety First! Kennedy's administration and staff vow to continue providing engaging lessons and support, while keeping the safety of all, a priority.

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
2nd Quarter Plan

The home-school connection will be vital to the success of our students. We know this is a very unsettling time and we will continue to make the wellbeing and safety of students, staff, and families our number one priority.

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

2020-2021 Quarter Two, Phase 3 Plan

What will students experience when they enter our building during Phase 3?

- Masks are required for all students entering the building and on the buses.
- Symptoms will be assessed on a daily basis, including temperature checks, before entering the building (must be under 100.4).
- All staff will be required to wear a mask, as well as conduct a daily symptom check.
- Sanitizing stations at entries/exits. Sanitation of all spaces between groups.
- Social distancing (6 feet apart) will be practiced at all times.
- First meal will be served in the classroom; second meal will be grab and go.

Remote Learning with Work Completion or Support Opportunities

- Students have been assigned a classroom teacher who will provide daily or weekly lessons via Google Classroom or See Saw.
- Remote virtual instruction and support will be provided frequently. Your child's teacher will provide times and links to their virtual sessions (ZOOM) on Google Classroom.
- Your child may be asked to participate in work completion sessions, assessments or progress monitoring, and/or interventions in the building as needed.
- If your child needs further support, please make arrangements with your teacher for an in-person appointment.

Digital Resources

- Please set aside at least one hour each day to have your students work on their digital resources: 30 minutes in Math, 30 minutes in Reading, in addition to checking-in, and completing their other assignments in Google Classroom or See Saw.
- Digital resources may include: Lexia, Learning A-Z (Raz-Kids), Reflex Math, Zearn, and Freckle, depending on teacher.

Instructional Constants

- All students will receive, and be expected to perform, grade-level, standards-based assignments.
- Music and PE units will be provided to students in digital format. Lessons will be available in their Google Classroom or See Saw assignment list.

Please feel free to call the school with any questions or concerns.

On-Line Work

Work assignments are posted on Google Classroom. Students should work OUTSIDE of their scheduled time with their teacher on their digital resources: Lexia, Freckle, Raz-Kids, etc. Contact us at 815-802-4501 with questions or concerns.

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


Phase 3 Remote Learning Plan November 13th – December 14th

Attendance

All students are required to check in with their teachers starting November 13th between 8:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. every day. Students that do not check in after 2 days will be reported to the school home visit team, who will work with the district truancy team and resource officers. Any face to face instruction must be preplanned with the building admin and teachers in collaboration with students and families.

STUDENT ENGAGEMENT LEVELS

- It's important that we have communication between students and their teachers during this time.

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November Phase 3 PreSchool Plan (KSD Campuses - Proegler/Mark Twain/Steuben):

Modified Phase 3 Plan (November 13th - December 14th):

- Teachers and Co-Teachers will identify any students, as well as special education students
 who need to be offered in-person learning opportunities based on academic/social emotional
 learning needs. Based on these needs and/or parent requests, teachers will pre-plan and
 arrange for in-person learning opportunities at each campus.
- Our 5 building wings will still be utilized and each classroom will operate as its own "section" and will not exceed 8 students/2staff at any given time. Teachers will create and share their schedule for in-person students with building administration.
- Social distancing, as well as additional PPE Measures such as shields, gowns, gloves and
 plastic dividers will be used in each classroom especially when social distancing measures
 cannot always be taken due to the age and needs of our students.
- In-person students will enter/exit through their assigned door and stay in their assigned building wing.
- Teachers will complete a building log with the number of students in the classroom/date/time in/time out.
- Teachers will continue to complete our Engagement Rating Google Document for each child on their classroom roster.
- During this time, all students will receive remote learning opportunities.
- Students who attend our two classrooms that house students whose families are essential workers will still receive <u>child care</u> provided by our paraprofessionals. These students will now receive their instruction remotely from their classroom teacher. Child care for these two classrooms will be provided Tuesday Friday from 8:00 am to 3:00 pm. Due to the size of these classes, we will break each classroom into an A class and a B class so that we do not exceed the 8 student/2 adult limit of 10 per section. Additional staffing will be needed to support this change. Daily transportation will be provided for students in these classrooms.
- Every Monday will continue as a Flex (Colloquium) Day Students working with teachers and teachers working with each other.
 - AM Tier 3 services will be offered to students in the form of in person learning and Tier 2 services will be provided via Zoom with Family Support Staff/Mental Health/Instructional Coaches
 - PM There will be Building Designated Time or Professional Development for Teachers and Staff (Remotely).
- Sanitation Needs and Cleaning
 - Sanitation will occur in classrooms from 11:00am -12:00pm daily in all student classrooms that have separate AM and PM Sessions.
 - Sanitation will occur in classrooms again at the end of the instructional day.
 - Sanitation will occur in restrooms and on playground areas.

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
