3. Honor

Dr. Walters stated that the District was honored to receive an award from the Kankakee Fire Department. She introduced Chief Damon Schuldt who spoke on the Kankakee Fire Department's 2017 Community Partners award that was presented to Kankakee School District. Chief Schuldt explained that a program was developed where they go into all the grade schools and talk about fire safety and a home escape plan. The students take the plan home with them and if they get their parents/guardians to sign off and 100% of their individual class brings them back, they receive a pizza party. The Fire Department said the pizza parties would not be possible without their community partners. Dominoes supply the pizza, Pepsi provides drinks, and Jewel/Osco provides all the plates, napkins, etc. He said the fire department reached out to all public and private K-3 grades and 1,642 students received pizza this year. Chief Schuldt thanked the school district and the teachers for allowing them to come in and present the program.
