Dr. Stipp, ONU

2. Dr. Stipp from Olivet Nazarene University

Dr. Stipp, a professor of education at ONU, reviewed the work he is doing on trauma and learning. He is currently working with four schools - Kennedy, Taft, Edison, and the junior high school. Dr. Stipp said his primary research question is: Does involvement in a trauma-informed training impact teachers' sense of efficacy for classroom management, and sense of preparedness for dealing with students' stress? He said that TBRI (Trust-Based Relational Intervention) was designed to provide concrete steps for caretakers (including teachers) to empower, connect, and correct students in ways that are trauma-informed and developmentally respectful. Dr. Stipp said his research data would be available by the fall in order to report to the Board.
