This program is held in the First Presbyterian Church on Court Street. Mary Jo Johnston was the Director of Special Education for many years and she retired from the school district as the Assistant Superintendent of Instruction. Dr. Walters said that Mrs. Johnston was the person that hired her as a school social worker in District #111. Dr. Walters said Mary Jo Johnston had a vision, she had a legacy, and she had a strong commitment to the education of all children. Dr. Walters said her own administrative career was defined by how Mrs. Johnston was as an administrator. She was compassionate, she was strategic, and she really had a commitment towards families and children regardless of whether they struggled or not. Principal's Report - Dr. Larry Gray, Kankakee Junior High School Principal

Dr. Gray began his report by recognizing his staff by asking them to stand. He reviewed the District goals, the pathways to success, AVID educators, and the IB Middle Years Program. He had three students, Maliyah Willis, Jocelyn Alvarado, and Cedric Williams, speak on the IB Learner Profile. Dr. Gray said the next steps for Kankakee Junior High School are 1) academic progress, 2) student behaviors, 3) culture and climate, and 4) high expectations for teaching and learning.

2018 Tentative Tax Levy

Mr. Grossi, Assistant Superintendent for Business Services, presented the 2018 tentative tax levy and stated that the tax levy will be on the agenda at the December 10th Board Meeting for approval. After the presentation, Mr. Grossi asked if there were any questions. Mr. Bohlen asked if the only increase from the levy is \$322,000. Mr. Grossi responded by saying that it is the projected increase from the CPI. This levy showed approximately 1.5 million in new property, which is the trend we usually see, and 6.7 million in additional TIF money.

President Wells asked for a motion to approve the tentative tax levy.

Motion was made by Gathing, seconded by Bohlen, to approve to accept the 2018 tentative tax levy as presented. ROLL CALL VOTE--Ayes: Bohlen, Gathing, Shea, Williams, Works, Archie, and Wells. Nays: none. Motion carried.

Carmen Huizenga, auditor from Smith, Koelling, Dykstra and Ohm, presented the District's 2017-2018 audit report.

She agreed to do so and Mr. Works volunteered to serve on the Policy Committee.
